



Jules MARCOU

20 Apr 1824-17 Apr 1898

French geologist, who was a protege of Agassiz and joined him in America during 1848. Acted as geologist on the U.S. Pacific railroad survey along the thirty-fifth parallel 1853 and on the basis of his field experience published a geological map of the United States (1855, 1858). A dispute after the Survey caused Marcou to return to Europe, bringing the fossil collection with him and some types described in 1858 were acquired by the BM(NH).
